GEORGE AND SYLVIA MELVILLE HOSPICE HOME

A brand new 200-bed state-of-the-art residential care facility featuring the George & Sylvia Melville Hospice Home is the first project to break ground of Peace Arch Hospital's \$110 million renovation and expansion plan that includes a new ER and five new operating suites.

Located across the street from the hospital, the facility will feature 185 beds earmarked for complex care and 15 private hospice beds in a separate and home-like environment.

Complex care beds will house patients in need of structured care and offer 24-hour medical support. The 112-bed residence is designed to provide an easy transition from home to residential care with large single rooms with private bathrooms and space for personal furnishings, décor and

belongings. There will be a secure wing of 73 beds for patients with geriatric mental health conditions who are experiencing behavioural issues and beds and equipment specifically designed to care for obese patients.

The George & Sylvia Melville Hospice Home will be awash with soothing, warm colours and comfortable furnishings. This calm and respectful environment is where people will come to live out their final weeks and days and are spending each End of life care is such an important part of the community.

ICU TRANSPORT MONITOR/ DEFIBRILLATOR

When a patient needs to transfer within the hospital from Emergency to the ICU or from the ICU to an operating room and cannot move from their bed, their equipment must move with them.

The monitor is transported alongside the patient and eliminates the need to have vital diagnostic equipment removed and reinserted at a different area of the hospital. It is also able to withstand a fall from bed height.

The additional component of also being a defibrillator provides both patient and hospital staff with peace of mind should there be a cardiac event during transport.





NEOPUFF MACHINES

These vital machines deliver much-needed oxygen to a newborn baby in distress. They are air-flow driven and don't require electricity to operate. They sustain oxygen delivery over long periods of time minimizing human error due to fatigue. Because of your donations we now have eight neopuffs, one for each birthing suite, ensuring medical staff can administer a steady and consistent stream of oxygen to a baby.

PHACO-EMULSIFIER MACHINE

Thanks to your generous donations, this new "intelligent" technology quickly detects changes in eye pressure, allowing for a safer and more efficient procedure of removing cataracts.

After the procedure – now one of the safest and most cost-effective surgeries in the world – the patient can walk out of surgery and be ready in just a few days to enjoy their regular activities.



Through your kind generosity, we have purchased critically-needed equipment for the hospital.

ICU BEDS

These beds do important work. One push of a button, for example, moves the patient from a lying position to sitting – so imperative to support healing and prevent complications in patients who are immobile. The beds' features and customization allow medical staff at Peace Arch Hospital to serve the needs of a diverse population at every stage of their recovery.

Thanks to you, our donors, we have purchased seven new ICU beds for patients who require critical care 24 hours a day.



PEDIATRIC MEDICAL IMAGING CHAIR

The Pediatric Medical Imaging Chair allows staff to take x-rays of young children, keeping them calm and comfortable during the procedure. It can be stressful for kids and their parents waiting for a prognosis after an injury and this chair makes the x-ray experience quicker and easier. Your donations have ensured that this highchair-like imaging seat is available right here at Peace Arch Hospital.

PORTABLE VENTILATOR

Thanks to your donations, and a generous grant from TB Vets, we were able to purchase another portable ventilator for patients who may have compromised breathing. This machine travels to the patient when help is needed instead of the patient being required to go to the machine.





We will soon have our state-of-the-art Emergency Department for the community of White Rock and South Surrey.

KEY FEATURES

- Ambulance entrance area from covered garage and a separate exit, including decontamination room and anteroom with storage space
- Combination triage/registration
- Three medical zones for acute, moderate and ambulatory patients
- Internal waiting rooms for all zones with adjacent lab and ECG rooms for each to decrease time for diagnostic testing
- Easily accessible, large resuscitation area for both adult and pediatric patients, designed with booms to maximize access to the patient
- Interdisciplinary team workrooms, acoustically isolated for privacy

- Isolation rooms with anterooms for protection of staff and public
- More and larger treatment rooms
- Care lounges for patients who are waiting for ongoing treatment but do not require a bed
- Designated Pediatric rooms with specialty equipment
- Designated Obstetrics + Gynecology room allowing minor treatments to be completed in the ER, allowing a quicker return home
- Enclosed Mental Health and Substance Use Zone
- Decontamination suite and disaster management supplies
