A Grand Opening for PAH Foundation Lodge



PAH Foundation Lodge, White Rock and South Surrey's new 200-bed residential care facility, officially opened its doors in April for patients needing long-term, hospice, and mental health care.

Located at 15575 16A Avenue, the state-of-the-art facility was built on land owned by Peace Arch Hospital Foundation and is being leased by Fraser Health to operate 112 long-term care beds, the 15-bed Melville Hospice Home, and 73 older adult mental health units.



The residence features single rooms with ceiling lifts and private en-suite bathrooms, a bariatric room on each floor, family spaces, and the option of connecting rooms for couples. In addition, there is an in-house hairdressing salon, beautiful outdoor gardens, and an on-site production kitchen.

The new 15-bed Melville Hospice Home replaces the seven-bed hospice located inside Peace Arch Hospital, allowing more patients the opportunity to stay in their home community to receive end-of-life care.



Peace Arch Hospital Foundation financed the construction and met its goal of raising \$10 million towards the \$47 million building costs through generous donations from the community. A grand opening celebration, ribbon cutting, and exclusive tour event was held on Saturday, March 7, 2020. Thank you to all who contributed to make this project possible!

New to the Peace Arch Hospital Campus, PAH Foundation Lodge is leading the way to create new and improved dining options.

With a full-scale production kitchen, customized menus, locally-sourced ingredients, and a passionate food-service team at the helm, residents now have something positive to look forward to every day.

Fresh meal items prepared on-site and more choices are welcome perks for patients, who may have experienced Peace Arch Hospital's existing style of service. The new 'neighborhood menu' at PAH Foundation Lodge will feature many new dining choices for residents, including comfort foods, roast dinners, and plant-based proteins. COVID-19 EMERGENCY FUND HIGHLIGHTS:

 **14,000+ MEALS** were purchased from 20 local businesses as part of our food delivery program for frontline medical staff. More than 70 local businesses donated 5,000 meals and snacks.

 **31 IPADS** were purchased for Peace Arch Hospital. This helped to ensure that our most vulnerable and fragile patients – including those in long-term care and psychiatric units – can virtually communicate with their loved ones or medical staff while physical distancing is required during COVID-19. An additional 50+ iPads and tablets were secured with the help of community donors.

 **18+ RAPID RESPONSE GRANTS** have been provided to local organizations in your community who have had to adapt their services or offerings due to COVID-19.

ER Construction Update



With construction well underway on site, we are thrilled to share another update on the progress of the first phase of our new ER, set to open in July 2021. This eagerly awaited project will see a new Emergency Department with three-times the treatment spaces!

If you happen to drive by Peace Arch Hospital, you will notice that we are currently in the framing stage of construction for our new ER. This means that the basement floor, exterior walls, and interior partitions are being assembled. Just as a skeleton serves as the supporting structure for our bodies, the frame that you see coming to life will be the underlying structure of our new ER.

“Once the new ER is fully framed, the focus of construction will move towards roughing in electrical and plumbing services, and ducting for heating, cooling, and ventilation,” says Stephanie Beck, Executive Director at Peace Arch Hospital Foundation.

Upon completion of phase one, this new-build will feature three care zones, larger trauma and resuscitation space, increased pediatric treatment areas, and specialty rooms for casts, sutures, gynecology, EENT, and a Mental Health & Substance Use Zone. Phase two of this project will see a renovation on our existing ER space.

This project was made possible thanks to donors like you. Thank you for your dedication to expanding health care capacity in your community. The new ER will truly serve the needs of our growing community for many years to come.

Operating Suites Campaign Closer to Completion...

With the help of our donors, we funded...

CT SCANNER — \$1.3 MILLION

A well-functioning CT Scanner is instrumental in helping to determine diagnosis and treatment, so we asked the public for help in raising funds to purchase a new unit for the hospital. The community quickly jumped on board because they knew that their friends, family, and loved ones may require a CT scan someday. Their donations, combined with a generous matching gift, allowed us to purchase this new machine.



PORTABLE ULTRASOUND MACHINE — \$65,000

This machine helps diagnose urgent problems like cardiac arrest and poor heart valve function. It also allows our ER team to check for life-threatening bleeding in trauma and non-trauma patients in order to provide immediate treatment. Because of its small size, it can be easily moved around the hospital, making it useful to all departments.

TWO TRAUMA STRETCHERS — \$24,000

Trauma Stretchers allow for ultimate mobility of patients during virtually every transport situation required for diagnosis and treatment. With the help of donors like you, we were able to secure two new trauma stretchers for Peace Arch Hospital.



Through your kind generosity, we have purchased critically-needed equipment for the hospital.

THREE ENDOSCOPIC CAMERAS — \$60,000

These small-but-mighty cameras provide detailed images inside the body in order to help doctors diagnose problems and create effective treatment plans.



ELECTROSURGICAL UNIT — \$16,000

This special unit is utilized by surgeons to create precise cuts and cause coagulation during surgery, which helps minimize bleeding and can allow patients to return home sooner. Electrosurgical units are commonly used during gynecological, cardiac, ocular, orthopedic, and urological procedures at Peace Arch Hospital.

CRASH CART DEFIBRILLATOR — \$ 25,000

Medical teams use the Defibrillator to resuscitate patients who have stopped breathing, or whose hearts have stopped beating. The cart makes the defibrillator fully mobile, which means it can be taken anywhere in the hospital, even outside, so that medical staff can meet ambulances as they pull in, resuscitating patients the very second they arrive.



Sources of fundraising revenue:




