Getting ready for an exciting new chapter

About the Project

Peace Arch Hospital is undergoing a \$91 million multi-phase renovation project that includes the expansion of the Emergency Department and Surgical Suites along with the relocation and upgrading of the Medical Device Reprocessing department. The new extension is a significant increase of space along with redesigned work and patient flow. The expanded Emergency Department will support our teams in continuing to provide quality care, in spaces better designed to meet the needs of patients. The new Surgical Suites will replace

three existing operating rooms with five new ones providing more surgeries for patients closer to home. The relocation of the Medical Device Reprocessing department closer to the Surgical Suites will provide improved access, infection control, and safety for patients, physicians, and staff.

PHASE 1

Projected to be complete Fall 2021 and includes the expansion of the Emergency Department, the perioperative area and the Medical Device Reprocessing department.

PHASE 2

Projected to be complete Summer 2022 and includes the renovation of the old emergency space and the expansion and relocation of Surgical Day Care, which includes one additional procedure room.

ER Construction Update





The hospital's clinical operations teams are finalizing service delivery plans for emergency, surgical, and Medical Device Reprocessing services in the new building. Services will increase as follows:

- Sophisticated ventilation systems, an in-suite sterile core, and dedicated AnteRooms are now included as part of the expansion to aid in infection control and to prevent the spread of hospital-acquired diseases. This will give medical teams a space to safely remove contaminated items before returning to non-contaminated spaces. Separating contaminated and non-contaminated areas in a hospital is essential to prevent the spread of disease and hospital-acquired infections.
- The surgical area will be more than twice the size as the existing space and will include five new operating rooms an increase from the current three and a 10-bed post anesthetic care unit. In Phase 1, surgical volumes will be similar to what we see today with the exception of the cataract service, which will increase to five days a week.
- The Medical Device Reprocessing department will be three times larger than the current space with substantially enhanced workflow to improve infection control practices.

'Zippy' the UVGI Robot

Killing harmful viruses one zap at a time!

Last year, donors like you helped provide an additional layer of infection control by funding the purchase of a new Ultraviolet Germicidal Irradiation Unit (UVGI Robot). The Ultraviolet Germicidal Irradiation Unit (UVGI Robt) – lovingly named 'Zippy' – was instrumental in our defense against the second wave of COVID-19 cases last fall and winter. And today, it continues to keep your hospital stay as clean as possible.

Think of it as a germ-zapping robot. It kills viruses, bacteria, and fungi. And it helps get rid of viruses like C.Diff or COVID-19. Even after a deep cleaning with bleach and other disinfectants, the UVGI robot can reach and eliminate any remaining harmful bacteria and viruses. Every single day, this helps save patient lives. Best of all, we have been able to use the robot in the ICU, in PAH Foundation Lodge, in operating rooms, and many other critical areas of the hospital.

"[Zippy] is essential to keep our hospitals as clean as possible," said Dr. Jean Lauzon, Peace Arch Hospital's Medical Director. "Even after a deep cleaning with bleach and other disinfectants, the UV Robot can reach and eliminate any remaining harmful bacteria and viruses. Every single day this could save a patient's life."

"This is a truly impactful gift for our community," said Stephanie Beck, Peace Arch Hospital Foundation's Executive Director. "Having a UVGI Robot at Peace Arch Hospital is a game-changer for treating and caring for our patients during a pandemic. We are so appreciative of our community's generosity."

MINI PORTABLE C-ARM X-RAY - \$90,000

The Emergency Department (ER) is an unpredictable and ever-changing environment. We see all types of patient presentations from strokes to heart attacks, broken bones, open wounds, and other life-threatening accidents. To help patients, medical teams must work quickly!

With the ability to tell our medical team immediately if a patient has a sprain or fracture at the exact point of care in the ER, this device results in a quicker diagnosis and treatment, and better care for emergency patients overall. Two neighbors, both anonymous longtime donors, challenged each other to make this generous gift. Our heartfelt gratitude goes out to these anonymous donors — you know who you are!

THREE ENDOSCOPIC CAMERAS - \$60,000

These small-but-mighty cameras provide detailed images inside the body, helping doctors diagnose problems and create effective treatment plans.

MOBILE LIFT - \$8,800

This lift helps to safely transport or re-position seniors, while also accommodating those who may be sensitive to under arm pressure. If we've learned anything over the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, we know that it's the little comforts that make all the difference. This mobile lift has helped improve seniors' overall experience at Peace Arch Hospital.

BED BLANKET WARMER - \$7,500

The risk for severe illnesses like COVID-19 increases with age, with seniors at the highest risk. And during last year's cold winter months, things like heart attacks, high blood pressure, pneumonia, and falls were more common - especially for seniors! This machine now helps pre-warm blankets for seniors, benefitting them psychologically as well as prepping them for surgery and relieving pain.






