# Expansion Updates



## We've grown and it shows...

Our brand-new Emergency Department, Operating Suites and Medical Device Reprocessing Unit opened in January 2022! THANK YOU to our incredible community of supporters for funding \$38.5 million towards the total project cost of \$91.05 million!

The new emergency department is nearly three times the size of the current facility with a private triage area, dedicated ambulance entrance, significantly more treatment areas, including specific pediatric and mental health spaces, isolation rooms and an improved layout and space configuration.

The new OR will meet best practice standards for modern surgical requirements, and will accommodate not only current needs, but the anticipated needs of our community for the next 20 years. Remember, community hospitals like Peace Arch Hospital are important for everyone and often mark central points in the lives of residents of all ages.

## PHASE 2 UPDATE

Phase 2 of our project is currently in progress and is on pace to open in Fall 2022! Completed renovations of our former ER will provide 10 additional treatment spaces, including a new Mental Health & Substance Use Zone. Upstairs, our former OR spaces will be transformed into a permanent home for Ophthalmology procedures, freeing up an extra Surgical Suite. Surgical Daycare will be moved from the ground floor, up to the renovated OR area, and is expected to be complete by early 2023.

## Project Highlights

### *Thanks to you:*

- In the Emergency Room department, patients are being seen in larger, more dignified private spaces.
- In OR/Ophthalmology, eye surgeries have increased from 1.5 to 4 days per week.
- Both ER and OR now have state-of-the-art ventilation systems to prevent the spread of hospital-acquired infections, such as COVID-19.
- The Medical Device Reprocessing department is now three times larger, with enhanced workflow to improve infection control.
- There will be a more visually welcoming space for treatment at the Mental Health and Substance Use Zone, with a safer and more productive design for both patients and staff.

## 1) NEW MEDICAL DEVICE REPROCESSING UNIT

*"The Medical Device Reprocessing Department is the heart of the hospital and touches almost every patient that visits. Our new department is closer to our operating suites and there is a new dedicated elevator for transporting soiled and clean items that is separate from the public ones. This allows us to transport equipment in a sterile environment directly to the operating rooms and reduce the overall time equipment spends in transportation between departments."*

## 2) NEW ANTEROOMS

These new AnteRooms were a late addition to our hospital's ER and OR expansion that aid in infection control and help prevent the spread of hospital-acquired disease. They give medical teams a sterile space with sophisticated ventilation systems to remove contaminated items before returning to non-contaminated spaces.

# Freezing Out Cancer, One Cell at a Time

## How the Ullrichs Made the Cryostat Happen

“The new cryostat in Peace Arch Hospital’s OR Frozen Section room allows a pathologist to provide diagnostic information to a surgeon while the patient is in the middle of the operation. The cryostat allows surgically removed tissue to be frozen solid and sliced for rapid diagnosis, helping to determine if the lesion is benign or malignant, and if the lesion has been completely removed. The results of this Frozen Section help to determine the next steps in the patient’s surgery – often

helping to avoid a second procedure.” – Dr. Carolyn Shiau, Regional Medical Director of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine.

Scott and Sheryl Ullrich understand the impact the cryostat has on surgery. “Over the years, our family has used Peace Arch Hospital and are grateful for the love and care we have received. When we learned about the cryostat and the critical diagnostic role it plays in the new OR, we knew this was an important piece of equipment and were thrilled to fund it,” they remarked.

**our medical teams can now use the following pieces of equipment and more to save lives and improve patient care!**



**PORTABLE ULTRASOUND (ER) - \$80,000**

The Emergency Department (ER) is an unpredictable and fast-paced environment. Every second counts. From broken bones and viral infections, to strokes and heart attacks, ER staff must act quickly to provide timely care.

This portable ultrasound device, that was funded by you, will be used for cardiac screening exams, to diagnose obstetrical and abdominal complaints, as a rapid triage tool, and more.

**VITAL SIGN MONITOR – MATERNITY - \$4,600**

This is a critical piece of equipment, monitoring vitals in real-time. Having this equipment will ensure the hospital has the capacity to provide urgent, up-to-date feedback for both mother and child in a time of great need.



**TONOMETER (ER) - \$8,000**

Used to measure the pressure inside your eyes, this tonometer aids in identifying glaucoma and measures how effective a patient's glaucoma treatments are. With eye surgery procedures increased at our hospital thanks to your support, it's a much-needed tool to deliver the best in care for our community.



### **INSTRUMENT SET FOR SHOULDER SURGERIES - \$53,300**

With our new and improved Operating Rooms, staff can now perform more surgeries, while ensuring top-level care for patients.

You have played a key role in the purchase of a state-of-the-art set of tools to help perform shoulder surgeries. OR staff can now perform shoulder surgery with greater ease and precision, which can help alleviate pain and mobility issues. You've enabled such a difference in quality of life for those around you with this purchase — thank you!

### **PENDULAM CAMERA – UROLOGY - \$12,000**

This life-saving camera can be used to detect everything from minor infections and kidney stones to prostate and bladder cancer. With your support, OR staff now have the camera needed to detect these cancers in their early stages, which is crucial for saving lives.




