New Surgical Daycare and Eye Care Unit Opens at Peace Arch Hospital

Construction is now complete on the new Surgical Daycare and Eye Care Unit on the second floor of the acute care building at Peace Arch Hospital. The new space is better designed to meet the needs of staff and patients with seamless transition through the surgical process.

As the main hospital for the communities of White Rock and South Surrey, Peace Arch Hospital provides a range of health care services including emergency, surgery, mental health care, and maternity care. Surgeries not requiring an overnight visit are coordinated through Surgical Daycare, where our teams of health professionals including registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, unit clerks, surgeons, and anaesthesiologists care for patients.

The new, modern Surgical Daycare space has 12 patient bays — up from eight. It is conveniently located next to the Operating Suite and the Post-Anesthesia Care Unit, eliminating the need to move patients from floor-to-floor for treatment.

The new area is better designed to meet the needs of surgical patients and will offer an improved patient and staff experience.

New Eye Care Unit Brings Clarity and Relief to Local Residents

For long-time Peace Arch Hospital user, Wendy Reid, being "in the dark" had increasingly become an accepted way of life.

"I had been experiencing what I thought was typical eyesight decline for years," she explained. "I went to an Optometrist, and she said I have cataracts and they're at the severity where I can get them removed. My original appointments were scheduled until the COVID-19 pandemic hit, but then those procedures were canceled or postponed overnight."

"I had such a hard time seeing at night, but also in the sun.

The sunlight blinded me," she recalled. "There were times where I was driving, and my vision was so bad I had to stop the car and pull over. I was scared — white knuckling it."

It became so fraught for Wendy that she went so far as to change her working hours to accommodate for a safe commute. "When I finally saw [Peace Arch Hospital Ophthalmologist], Dr. Berman, he said that my cataracts were so bad he would need to operate on them immediately. I had my first procedure in May in the new eye care unit. It was quick and painless. The procedure itself only took 10 minutes or so." She went back in June for her other eye.

"Four days after, the fog in my eye lifted. I could see again."

"Colours are now more vibrant. There's more contrast in what I see. I can drive at any time, day or night, with ease and confidence. I can read computer screens at work without squinting or adjusting my posture. I went to a restaurant recently, and in the dim lighting, I could read the menu again. It's just been a life-changer."

Thanks to you, Wendy and many others in the community face shorter wait times for cataract and other eye procedures.

"I got my life back," Wendy remarked, holding back tears.

Creating a healthier, more inclusive future... one step at a time!

Parallel bars serve as an essential tool for assisting patients in regaining their mobility and strength following injury, illness, or surgery. These sturdy bars provide a secure framework for patients to hold onto while practicing walking, weight-bearing exercises, and other therapeutic movements.


This significant upgrade makes a pivotal moment in our hospital's commitment to providing the highest quality care to our community. The installation of these new parallel bars has already begun to revolutionize the rehabilitation experience for our patients. "Unlike our outdated model that was 20 years old, the new parallel bars offer enhanced flexibility and adaptability," says Kim Stang, Clinical Services Manager at Peace Arch Hospital. "Patients of varying mobility levels can now receive tailored and therapeutic interventions. improving their chances of regaining independence and mobility."

"This upgrade ensures that every individual, regardless of their physical challenges, can access the care they deserve, promoting a quicker and more effective recovery process," adds Alice Crawford, Physical Therapist at Peace Arch Hospital. "Features of the new bars include a solid base to assist with balance work, bariatric capacity, adjustable bar

height, and an adjacent mirror for visualizing steps."

By offering support and stability, parallel bars enable patients to gradually increase strength and coordination, facilitating a smoother and more effective recovery. For patient partner and amputee, Thelma, the new parallel bars were instrumental in getting back upright and adjusting to the new normal of a prosthetic leg. "I'm so grateful for the new equipment, it really changes the patient experience and helps people like me get back on their feet quicker," she says.

Your support has not only transformed the rehabilitation journey for our patients but also contributed to the overall excellence of Peace Arch Hospital's services. The addition of these modern parallel bars stands as a testament to the profound impact that community collaboration can achieve.

Helping Kids in your Community



Calming Children in a Time of Need

Going to the ER can be an anxious experience at any age. It can be especially scary for children, particularly if they're in pain, which is often the case when visiting the ER. That's why Peace Arch Hospital ER physician, Dr. Amir Behboudi, teamed up with a local puppeteer and ventriloquist.

"It's about trying to make the ER less scary for kids," remarked Dr. Amir Behboudi. "We want to decrease children's anxiety when they come to the hospital."

After witnessing his own son's positive response to the puppets, Dr. Behboudi secured funding through Peace Arch Hospital Foundation to launch new programming for children at Peace Arch Hospital. This innovative project was funded through our Peace Arch Hospital and Fraser Health Community Grant stream, which aims to support employees of PAH in their efforts to enhance patient care in areas that are not typically funded by Fraser Health Authority.

With support from this grant, Dr. Behboudi was able to garner the expertise of Kellie Haines, a puppeteer and ventriloquist. They created six videos about common ER scenarios: X-ray, ultrasound, blood draw, CT scans, starting an IV and procedural sedation.

The video series, entitled Magrau

and Kellie and the Hospital. features Haines with one of her puppets, a large and rather absent-minded bird named Magrau.

In the videos, Magrau and Kellie, with the assistance of Peace Arch Hospital medical staff, talk about what's about to happen, and show each step of every procedure.

Cardiac services improved with this tax-smart gift from the heart

Because of donor generosity in 2022...

Our medical teams can now use the following pieces of equipment (and more!) to save lives and improve patient care!

ENDOSCOPIC CYSTOSCOPE - SURGICAL OUTPATIENT DEPARTMENT - \$20,000

A specialized thin tube with a camera and light at the end, Cystoscopes are used to examine the ureter and bladder. Because of you, physicians have another lifesaving tool to determine if a loved one has tumours, stones, or cancer, among other diagnoses.





RESPIRATORY MONITOR – MATERNITY DEPARTMENT - \$6,700

A respiratory monitor reads the function of your respiratory system and heart. This respiratory monitor is used in the maternity ward to monitor the well-being of newborns. Thanks to *you*, we have improved equipment to safeguard the well-being of babies born in White Rock.

PORTABLE ULTRASOUND – OPERATING DEPARTMENT - \$45,000

Things can change in an instant in the operating room. Whether it's bone imaging, a viral infection, cardiac concerns, or anything in-between, it's imperative for the health of the patient that surgeons have access to imaging tools during procedures.

This portable ultrasound device, used for rapid determinations during surgeries to save lives, was funded by *you*. Thank you.



GLIDESCOPE BLADE (TITANIUM LOPRO T4) - OPERATING DEPARTMENT - \$6,500

Glidescopes allow technicians to intubate patients for surgery. This donor-funded glidescope makes intubation a painless, seamless process for both technician and patient. With a camera on the end, it allows surgeons a crystal-clear view of the airway and vocal cords, improving the experience for both routine and more difficult intubation scenarios. No one wants the added stress, and even injury in some cases, of a difficult intubation during surgery, and thanks to you, the chances of that are now lower.



CARDIOLOGY STRESS TEST TREADMILL SYSTEM (GE CASE 7) -**CARDIOLOGY - \$42,000**

A stress test helps a doctor find out how well your heart handles work. This exercise stress test system is used to:

• Diagnose coronary artery disease


• Diagnose possible heart-related causes of symptoms, such as chest pain, shortness of breath, or light-headedness

• Determine a safe level of exercise

• Check the effectiveness of procedures done to improve coronary artery circulation in patients with coronary artery disease

• Predict risk of dangerous heart-related conditions such as a heart attack

A cardiac disease or event can be a scary thing. Thanks to you, physicians at Peace Arch Hospital can catch serious heart issues earlier, saving lives.
