Now and Then: Celebrating 70 Years of Care at Peace Arch Hospital

Peace Arch Hospital stands as a testament to the power of community spirit and dedication. Since its inception, it has evolved from a small community facility to a state-of-the-art medical centre, continually growing and improving with the steadfast support of both Peace Arch Hospital Foundation and the Peace Arch Hospital Auxiliary.

The Early Days

The story of Peace Arch Hospital began in the late 1940's, driven by a group of visionary women who recognized the need for a local healthcare facility. At that time, residents had to travel considerable distances to receive medical care. The idea of a hospital in White Rock was a dream nurtured by the community's pioneers who believed in accessible and high-quality healthcare for all.

In 1951 one of the Auxiliary's members, Mrs. Amy Weatherby, donated a 5-acre site for the new hospital and other citizens rallied with pledges of labour, trucks, and money. Three years of construction ensued, and the Auxiliary dutifully spent every minute drumming up support.

In 1954, this dream became a reality. On August 25, 1954, Peace Arch Hospital opened its doors, marking a significant milestone in the region's history. The original facility was modest, with just a few beds and basic medical equipment, but it was a beacon of hope for the residents of White

Rock and South Surrey.

The hospital wouldn't be here without the vital entity that came 6 years before it — the Peace Arch Hospital Auxiliary Society. This dedicated group of female volunteers has played an indispensable role in supporting the hospital since day one. The Auxiliary's mission was simple yet profound: to raise funds and provide essential services to support the hospital's operations and enhance patient care.

The Auxiliary quickly became the heart and soul of the hospital, organizing fundraising events, managing the gift shop, and offering a helping hand wherever needed. Their tireless efforts not only generated crucial funds but also fostered a sense of community and solidarity. Over the years, the Auxiliary's contributions have been nothing short of remarkable, funding vital equipment, supporting patient programs, and ensuring the hospital's smooth functioning.

Medical Imaging Campaign

New Medical Imaging Equipment takes centre stage at Peace Arch Hospital!

With the Foundation's \$10 million medical imaging campaign having reached the finish line, new equipment pieces are now in use at Peace Arch Hospital. Three new Portable Ultrasound Units have arrived along with a 3D Mammography Unit and new Digital X-Ray and Fluoroscopy Units.

Our radiology department has introduced new cutting-edge technology to enhance patient care. The Mammography Unit now uses x-rays to create 3D breast images, improving cancer detection accuracy and reducing false positives in dense tissue. The new Digital X-Ray machine efficiently detects fractures, tumors, pneumonia, and more, significantly reducing patient wait times with its superior software and lower maintenance.

Additionally, our upgraded Fluoroscopy equipment provides

real-time imaging for precise pain injections and accurate diagnoses of heart and intestinal conditions, ensuring more reliable scans and minimizing procedure disruptions.

New state-of-the-art equipment is a major factor in retaining current staff, as well as attracting new physicians and technologists to our hospital. This \$10 million medical imaging campaign for the best technology possible ensures Peace Arch has what it needs to treat our patients right in their community, close to home.

The remaining pieces still set to arrive and funded in the campaign include a new MRI and Gamma Camera. Your contributions are hard at work, making Peace Arch Hospital better equipped, and in turn, improving and saving the lives of your family, friends, and neighbours.

Advancing Anesthesia: How the Portable Ultrasound is leading to Better Outcomes in Peace Arch Hospital's OR

Peace Arch Hospital's operating rooms have recently welcomed a cutting-edge portable ultrasound, revolutionizing the care provided by anesthesiologists. This state-of-the-art device is enhancing patient safety, improving procedural accuracy, and optimizing both intraoperative and postoperative care. The acquisition of this advanced technology was made possible through a generous donation from dedicated donors Ed and Johanna Kampschuur.

Since it's arrival, anesthesiologists at Peace Arch Hospital have been leveraging the new portable ultrasound for a variety of critical tasks in the operating department.

Its real-time imaging capabilities are invaluable for performing regional anesthesia and nerve blocks, allowing precise needle guidance to target nerves while avoiding nearby structures. This enhances the effectiveness of pain management techniques and reduces the risk of complications.

"Patients with hip fractures are at an elevated risk of complications, such as delirium, and reducing narcotic use greatly helps to reduce the levels of delirium We're happy to give back in support of this life-saving equipment for the community in which we live."

The new ultrasound also plays a crucial role in assisting medical teams. "The portability of the ultrasound allows greater accessibility to patients, allowing physicians to implement nerve blocks wherever necessary in the hospital," adds Dr. Cheng.



AMBU® ASCOPE™ 5 BRONCHO - \$11,000

Peace Arch Hospital's Respiratory Therapy Department recently acquired a state-of-the-art Single Use Bronchoscope, the Ambu® aScope™ 5 Broncho, an innovative device that enhances patient care by providing high-quality imaging and increased safety through its single-use design, eliminating the risk of cross-contamination. It offers unparalleled flexibility and precision, allowing our skilled respiratory therapists to perform essential diagnostic and therapeutic procedures with greater efficiency and accuracy.





SIM JUNIOR (INTERACTIVE PEDIATRIC SIMULATOR) - \$67,000

We're thrilled to introduce "Sim Junior," our new Interactive Pediatric Simulator (IPS) representing a 6-year-old boy. This state-of-the-art simulator allows our medical staff to practice a wide range of pediatric skills, from routine care to managing critical emergencies like respiratory failure.

SimJunior provides realistic simulations with vital signs monitoring, speech capability, palpable pulse, and the ability to simulate breathing and blood flow. This training is vital in our ER department, preparing doctors to diagnose and treat children effectively, especially amidst the recent rise in respiratory illnesses.




SIX ENDOSCOPES (LAPAROSCOPE) — \$14,400 EACH

Six cutting-edge Endoscopes (Laparoscopes) are now available for use in our Operating Department! This advanced equipment significantly enhances our capabilities in minimally invasive surgeries, providing high-definition imaging and superior precision. The new laparoscopes allows our skilled surgeons to perform complex procedures with greater accuracy, reducing recovery times and improving patient outcomes.

THREE C6 RESPIRATORY VENTILATORS — \$83,000 EACH

We welcomed three new C6 Respiratory Ventilators in 2023, significantly enhancing our capacity to provide life-saving respiratory support to patients in need. These advanced ventilators improve treatment outcomes, especially in critical care scenarios, ensuring we can meet the respiratory needs of our growing community with precision and efficiency.

TONOMETER (EYE PRESSURE TESTER) — \$10,000

In an Emergency Department setting, time is of the essence, and accurate diagnostics can be life changing. The Tonometer plays a vital role in detecting and managing conditions like glaucoma, which can lead to permanent vision loss if not promptly addressed. Elevated eye pressure is a critical indicator, and the Tonometer provides our medical team with rapid and precise measurements.

By having this advanced tool readily available, we can quickly assess patients presenting with eye-related emergencies, ensuring they receive timely and appropriate care. This not only improves immediate patient outcomes but also helps prevent long-term complications that could severely impact their quality of life.

TWO PORTABLE ULTRASOUNDS — \$72,000 EACH

In addition to the Portable Ultrasound funded by Ed and Johanna Kampschuur (see Page 6), two other types of portable ultrasounds have been purchased by donors, significantly enhancing our diagnostic capabilities, and enabling quicker and more accurate assessments for patients in various departments. The best part? Access to immediate imaging support during critical situations!
