Hospital Upgrades

Medical Imaging Department

In 2024, brand new equipment arrived in the Francis Barrie Stewart Medical Imaging Department at Peace Arch Hospital: three new Portable Ultrasound units, a 3D Mammography unit, a Digital X-Ray, and a Fluoroscopy unit.

Our Radiology Department has introduced new cutting-edge technology to enhance patient care.

The Mammography Unit now uses x-rays to create 3D breast images, improving cancer detection accuracy and reducing false positives in dense tissue.

The new Digital X-Ray machine efficiently detects fractures, tumours, pneumonia, and more, significantly reducing patient wait times with its superior software and lower maintenance.

Our upgraded Fluoroscopy equipment provides real-time imaging for precise pain injections and accurate diagnoses of heart and intestinal conditions, ensuring more reliable scans and minimizing procedure disruptions.

Two remaining pieces of equipment funded as part of our IMAGINE campaign are set to arrive in fall 2026: an MRI and a Gamma Camera.

"The new 3D unit in Diagnostic Mammography has improved image quality. The tomosynthesis feature enables us to better visualize a dense breast. I'm certain we have found more breast cancers as a result. The new unit comes with curved paddles that seem to be more comfortable for the patient when applying compression, which is an important part of the exam. The more we can spread the breast tissue out, the less likely a breast cancer can hide. This has improved the patient's experience, especially for nervous patients. The control panel has an adjustable height which contributes to proper body ergonomics for both our shorter and taller Technologists.

New Production Kitchen



A PRODUCTION KITCHEN CAMPAIGN FOR A HEALTHIER TOMORROW

Now that our IMAGINE campaign has successfully concluded, we launched our *Healing Starts Here* campaign for a new production kitchen at Peace Arch Hospital. With fresh ingredients, scratchcooked meals, and choice dining on the way after the renovation, our Red Seal chefs are instilling the belief that food can heal, not only your body but also your spirit. In cooperation with dietitians and food service staff, they are guiding the renovation of Peace Arch Hospital's retherm kitchen into a full-scale production kitchen and collaborating to serve choice, dignity, and comfort on every plate.

Because meals served in the

pre-prepared, our chefs have limitations on what they can customize for patients, especially those with dietary restrictions, allergies, or personal preferences. This lack of control contributes to the staggering food waste currently at Peace Arch Hospital:

Approximately 50% of prepared meals go uneaten!

Behind every statistic is a patient longing for the autonomy to choose their meals or serving times. Due to the current kitchen setup, patients are served on a set schedule with a pre-determined menu and can miss out on nourishment due to medical appointments or looking for something they are unable to receive.

Our *Healing Starts Here* campaign will redefine hospital food. Not only will Peace Arch Hospital now offer delicious and nutritious meals, it will also incorporate a

patients will be able to choose what they'd like to eat, with flexibility in serving times to accommodate individual care needs. With a new online ordering app and rotating menu, a patient's family members can order in the app from afar for their loved ones too.

With construction tentatively starting in September 2025, our fundraising campaign for the production kitchen is well underway. We have raised 81% of our \$5 million goal to fund this transformation, which includes state-of-the-art kitchen equipment, a fully upgraded cafeteria, and food production infrastructure to accommodate the preparation of fresh, nutritional meals on-site. Supporting this initiative will ensure that PAH remains the best possible option for quality care for all patients, including the 200+ long-term care residents who call Peace Arch home, and for our



Urology Equipment

The Golden Standard: Advanced Urology Equipment at Peace Arch Hospital

Last September, in honour of Urology Awareness Month, PAHF raised funds for top-notch urology equipment to ensure Peace Arch Hospital's operating rooms have the latest urology tools. Many in our community stepped up to support this effort to make this upgrade possible, including extraordinary donors Neil & Karla Kerr who made a transformational \$182,000 gift to fully fund this equipment. Because of this generosity, all the equipment has now been received and is fully in use. This includes five laparoscopes, two resectoscopes, one ureterorenoscope, one ureteroscope, and one uretherotome, all helping our hospital continue to deliver high-quality urological care with state-of-the-art equipment.

These tools are not merely equipment; they are lifelines for our patients. They are crucial for evaluating kidney, prostate, and bladder conditions, helping inform detailed treatment plans, as well as for performing minimally invasive surgeries, reducing recovery times, and offering the best possible patient outcomes.



New Physician Engagement Centre Opens in January 2024

Centre at Peace Arch

doctors to take a break
between shifts, interact
with other physicians, and
even grab a quick coffee or
a snack.

The space is quiet and comfortable. It includes sleep rooms, lockers, a kitchen, several meeting areas, and space for the physicians or the Foundation to share upcoming events and seminars around the hospital and greater White Rock/South Surrey community.

The new sleep rooms are much more comfortable and convenient for on-call physicians due to their central location within the hospital. As an added bonus, physicians no longer have to worry about poor cell service in the lounge, which was an issue for many years.

The new meeting room is a favourite for many of the physicians, as it gives them the space to give educational presentations, hold monthly department meetings, and other collaborative sessions to discuss patient care.

Our medical teams can now use the following pieces of equipment (and more!) to save lives and improve patient care:

SENSORY STIMULATION CEILING MOUNT PROJECTOR — \$19,000

Studies show that long-term care residents respond positively to various recreational and therapeutic activities. So thanks to donors like you, there is now a mounted ceiling projector for residents at Ellen Sinclair Kennett Lodge.

This projector can engage these individuals through sensory stimulation activities by projecting dynamic visual scenes, soothing imagery, or interactive games onto surfaces in common areas or individual rooms. It helps provide residents with stimulating and immersive experiences that can enhance mood, cognition, and overall well-being, fostering a sense of engagement and connection within the care environment.





RAPID INFUSER PUMP - \$55,500

A rapid infuser pump is a medical device used to deliver large volumes of fluids, such as blood products, intravenous (IV) fluids, or medications to a patient quickly and efficiently. These pumps are designed to warm up and administer fluids at a high flow rate, allowing for rapid resuscitation or fluid replacement in emergency situations and other cases where rapid fluid administration is critical.

By providing rapid and controlled fluid delivery, these devices help our medical teams manage patients' fluid status and stabilize their condition effectively.

ARTHROSCOPIC INSTRUMENT SET -\$22,800

This instrument set is a specialized collection of surgical tools to aid our staff during orthopaedic surgeries. This set typically includes a variety of instruments designed for visualization, tissue manipulation, and debridement within the shoulder joint, allowing surgeons to perform minimally invasive procedures with precision and control.

FIVE PANDA INFANT WARMERS — \$46,000 EACH

Peace Arch Hospital's Maternity Department recently acquired five upgraded infant warmers. These pieces are essential for maintaining a newborn's body temperature, which is critical for their well-being in the delicate early hours after birth. By preventing hypothermia and supporting the baby's thermoregulation, they help stabilize vital functions, reduce the risk of complications, and promote a smooth transition to life outside the womb.





TWO ANALYZERS & A GENERAL CENTRIFUGE — \$41,700

In Peace Arch Hospital's Clinical Lab, you have helped fund two analyzers and a general centrifuge, equipping this vital department with state-of-the-art equipment. Both devices allow medical staff to analyze various medical samples efficiently and accurately. The general centrifuge aids in separating unnecessary microbes from samples and the analyzers thoroughly examine these samples. The pair of equipment helps inform treatment options, ultimately improving patient outcomes.

MOBILE PATIENT LIFT — \$15,000

Mobile patient lifts are essential for safe transfers, preventing injuries to both patients and caregivers while preserving patient dignity. They streamline the transfer process, enhancing efficiency and accessibility in various healthcare settings. Your support made it possible for us to provide this essential equipment to our long-term care patients, ensuring they experience comfort, care, and dignity during every transfer.
