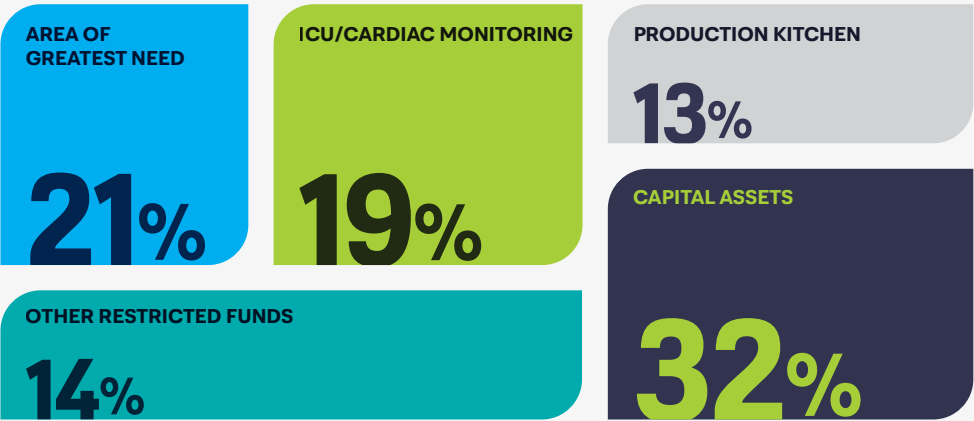

Fundraising revenue: \$15.49M

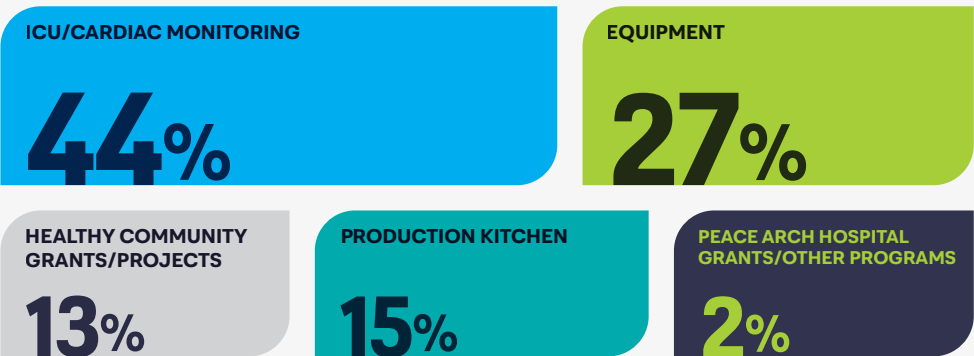
Sources of fundraising revenue:

Equipping our teams for better care

Thanks to donor support, Peace Arch Hospital's medical teams are using new equipment to save lives, improve patient care, and support better outcomes across the hospital.



EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

Automatic CPR Machine — \$20,000

Provides consistent, high-quality chest compressions during cardiac arrest, allowing medical staff to focus on other life-saving care. Funded through donations to our Holiday Direct Mail campaign.

CLINICAL LAB

Hematology Analyzer — \$120,000

Quickly and accurately analyzes blood samples, giving physicians detailed results to assess a patient's health and guide treatment decisions.

RESPIRATORY THERAPY

Airvo — \$9,700 each

Delivers warm, humidified oxygen at high flow rates to support patients with respiratory distress, improve oxygenation, and reduce the need for more invasive ventilation.

PHYSIOTHERAPY

NeuroGym Lift — \$7,000

Supports mobility and strength training through controlled sit-to-stand movements, helping patients improve balance, coordination, and independence.



SURGICAL OUTPATIENT

Adult (4) & Paediatric (2) Colonoscopes — \$45,000 each Six new state-of-the-art colonoscopes help physicians examine the colon more accurately for polyps, cancer, and other abnormalities.



MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

Bladder Scanner — \$18,000

A non-invasive handheld ultrasound device that measures bladder volume in real time, helping guide treatment while reducing unnecessary catheter use and infection risk.

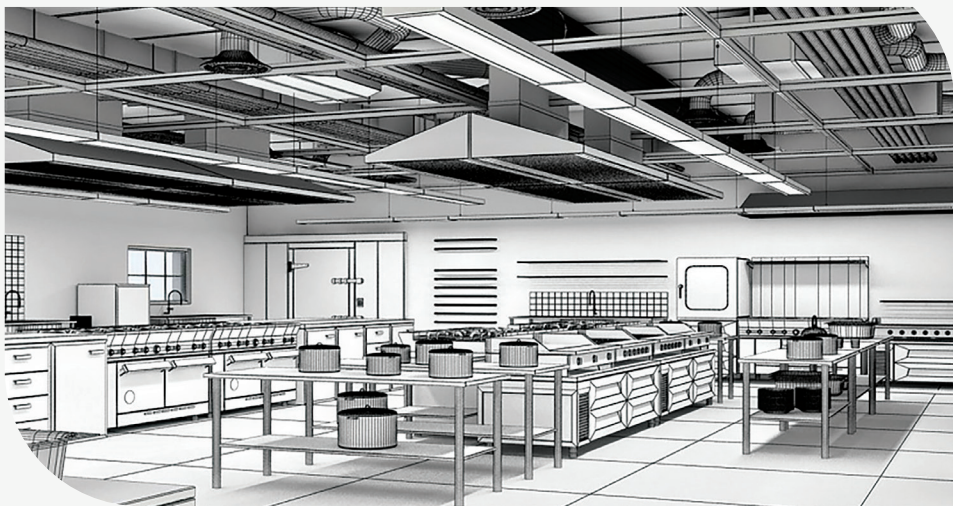
A new production kitchen arrives this year

We exceeded our \$5 million goal for the ***Healing Starts Here*** campaign, raising a total of \$5.5 million! Our plan to build a new production kitchen and upgrade food services infrastructure at Peace Arch Hospital was an incredible success. We are excited for our Red Seal chefs and kitchen teams to begin rolling out fresh meals for patients in our new kitchen early next year!

The cafeteria is still undergoing construction and is projected to open in early 2027.

This project redefined hospital food. Not only is Peace Arch Hospital now offering delicious and nutritious meals, but the new Choice Dining program will begin in early 2027 as well. This will allow patients to choose their meals from a rotating menu of options on their own schedule. There will also be a new online ordering app where patients' family members can place orders from afar for their loved ones.





The new kitchen would not have been possible without the generous support of our donors. **We owe a special thank you to Ed and Johanna Kampschuur, who donated \$2 million to this campaign.** The Kampschuurs understand how important nutritional food is to maintain an excellent quality of life, as evidenced by their

commitment to eating a healthy diet. The development of this new production kitchen is important to them because both have experienced the food from the old retherm kitchen. They have also seen friends refuse retherm food at the hospital because of how unappealing it was.

The momentum continues

The kitchen has recently welcomed several new pieces of commercial-grade cooking equipment, including a high-capacity tilt skillet, steam kettle, blast chiller, and advanced cooking systems. These additions will allow our Red Seal chefs to prepare fresher, made-from-scratch meals with ease while expanding healthcare menu options in the coming months.



New projects started in 2025

Thanks to donor support, PAHCHF was able to move several important community and hospital projects forward this year.



Generations Splash Pad

A new accessible splash pad was added to White Rock's Generations Playground, creating an inclusive space for community members of all ages and abilities. The project was made possible through a generous \$100,000 estate gift from the Denis and Yvonne Blakely Trust to our Healthy Community Grant Program.



ICU + Cardiac Monitoring Unit

A \$35 million campaign is underway to create a fully integrated ICU and Cardiac Monitoring Unit at Peace Arch Hospital, with completion expected in 2028. The new, expanded space will enhance infection control and critical care while providing private patient rooms with windows, glass doors, family space, and ensuite washrooms.



Foundry South Surrey-White Rock

PAHCHF has committed \$2 million of the \$6.45 million project cost to open a Foundry centre near the hospital with our partner, SOURCES. The centre is expected to open in late 2027 and will provide youth ages 12-24 with integrated mental health, physical health, social services and peer support, helping reduce demand on our hospital services.
